Your child has been given a reading pack from school.


This includes: -

A reading session only needs to be 5-10 minutes and there is no expectation that they complete the whole book in one go; reading a few pages at a time is fine, aim for at least 3 times per week

- Super reading today! He / She could identify all the letter sounds!
- Really good try! He / She was beginning to blend the sounds to read words!
- *Child's name* was a little tired tonight so we completed a few pages in the reading book and then mom / dad read the story book, whilst they listened.
- Wonderful understanding! He / She could tell me who all the characters were!
- Today *child's name* answered questions showing their understanding of the story.
- Good reading but he / she was unsure of the word (insert unknown vocabulary) so we talked about what it meant.
