Exploring Our School Values:

We take pride in our six core values: love, honesty, respect, peace, endurance, and friendship. These values form the foundation of our school community, guide our actions and interactions every day and are an outward sign of our school vision.

British Values:

- Depict a story about respect from the Bible in a creative format of your choice, explaining how it shows the British values (comic strip, PowerPoint, art, etc.).

Remember, these are just a few ideas to inspire your creativity. Feel free to let your imagination run wild and create a project that resonates with your child's interests and talents.

Celebrating Student Work:

We are eager to showcase the incredible projects that will emerge so please ensure that your completed projects are handed in to your child's teacher by Friday 27th June 2025. Each class teacher will select one outstanding respect project related to the British values. The chosen student will receive one of our school values badges, symbolising their dedication to our core values, and a special gift in a service in church.

Value-Themed Service:

To conclude the term, we will hold a special value-themed service in our church, where the selected students will have the opportunity to share their work with the entire school community and receive their values badge in front of their parents/carers.
